### Call before you dig!

If you plan to dig around buried gas piping, first dial 811 or call the Georgia One Call Center at 800-282-7411 three (3) days before you or your contractor dig so that all buried cable may be located. This is a free service. Flags mark where cables are buried. Flag colors represent various types of buried lines. Red denotes electric power lines, cable, conduit, and lighting cables. Orange is for telecommunication, alarm, or signal lines, cable, or conduit. Yellow represents natural gas, oil, steam, petroleum, or other gaseous or flammable materials. Green means there are sewers and drain lines. Blue is for drinking water. Purple is for reclaimed water, irrigation, and slurry lines. Pink shows temporary survey markings and unknown facilities. White denotes proposed excavation limits or routes.
